8 Alterations and Amendments to Rules

Voting

Voting will be by a show of hands or a paper ballot at the discretion of the President or at a club request. Ballot papers will be issued at this meeting. **Ballot Paper 'A'** to be used for proposals 1 to 26. **Ballot Paper 'B'** for proposals 27-35. Club Representatives please ensure you bring pens/pencils etc

Proposals 1 to 26 to be voted on by all clubs - 2 or more teams 2 votes, 1 team 1 vote

- (1) **Rules 6.7.1 & 30 (i) Amend the final sentence to read:**
A deposit of £50, *which will be refunded if the Appeal is won* but may be forfeited if the Appeal is lost, shall accompany the Notice of Appeal.

NEWQUAY CRICKET CLUB

- (2) **Create new Rule 13.2.3.2**
The outfield and square are marked prior to the game's start and only the pitch is marked at the game's end.
LMC Comment – this proposal only applies to division 3 clubs and below that use the report sheet marking system

LUDGVAN CRICKET CLUB

- (3) **Amend Rule 14 - Player Qualifications**
Amend Rule 14.1.13 to read: Apart from the Registered Professional *or Seasonal Overseas player* see 14.2 and 14.3, no player shall receive payment from the club, or any other interested party, eg. Business, sponsor etc for playing or providing any services. *Clubs shall be limited to one Registered Professional OR one 'Seasonal' overseas player per club.*

Amend Rule 14.2 - Overseas Players

Amend Rule 14.2.1 to read: Exceptions may be made upon application to the LMC via Assistant Secretary, in cases of overseas nationals living in the county or temporary resident in the county where they are in possession of *a Sporting Visitor's Visa and in compliance with the Border Agency regulations regarding this type of Visa. To remove any conflict between the Border Agency regulations and CCL rules 'Seasonal' overseas players registered under this scheme, clubs may make payment to the player to cover travel costs and provide living accommodation. Clubs must not make any payment to the player for playing cricket or providing any services but may make reasonable basic daily subsistence payments to the player.*

Delete existing rules 14.2.1.1, 14.2.1.2 and 14.2.1.3

Create New Rule 14.2.1.1. to read: *'Seasonal' overseas player definition is a player that spends less than 12 months in Cornwall or Devon in the current year. All such players are to be registered annually with the assistant secretary and such registration shall lapse at the end of the current playing year season.*

Amend Rule 14.3 - Professional Players

Amend Rule 14.3.1.1 to read: No other playing member in the club, apart from *the registered professional OR 'Seasonal' overseas player*, shall receive financial support or services or goods of any kind from the club or any other party associated with the club eg sponsors, businesses etc for playing for the club. The club may employ a playing member to undertake contractual commercial services for the club such as maintenance of premises and playing facilities. *This exception does not apply to the Registered Professional or 'Seasonal' overseas player.*

CAMBORNE CRICKET CLUB

Should Proposal 3 above fail the following proposal (4) to be considered:

- (4) **Rule 14.2.1.3. Amend to read:**
Clubs to be limited to one 'seasonal' overseas player *per club.* 'Seasonal' overseas player definitionetc

WADEBRIDGE CRICKET CLUB

Should Proposal 3 above fail the following proposal (5) to be considered:

- (5) **Overseas Players Amend to read:**
14.2.1 Exception may be made upon application to the LMC via Assistant Secretary in cases of overseas nationals living in the County or temporary resident in the County where they are in possession of a current visa issued by the UK Border Agency under the Points Based System, Youth Mobility or Sports Visitor.

- (6) **Create new Rule 17.3.6.1**
If such a team finishes outside the bottom two then the team finishing second from bottom will not be relegated. In the case of only one team being relegated it will be in place of the team finishing bottom. Where there would have been no relegation an additional team will be promoted from the division below.
TIDEFORD CRICKET CLUB

- (7) **Amend Rule 3.3.3** – proposals for the election of Life Members and Vice-Presidents must be made in writing and lodged with the Secretary of the CCL at least 28 days before the AGM.
Amend Rule 3.8 - 3.8.1.1 Life Members
3.8.1.2 Vice Presidents
and then renumber other posts
Amend 6.6.1.1 - ...own Chairman who shall sit on the LMC.
LMC Comment – Minor amendments to correct omissions etc
- (8) **Create new Rule 3.8.3 to read:** One of the County Child Welfare Officer shall as of right sit on the LMC.
Add to title – Rule 7.2 Club Requirements – Rule 7.2 shall be managed by the CCB appointed County Child Welfare Officers who shall report any Club not fulfilling these requirements to the LMC. One of the County Child Welfare Officers will sit on the LMC.
LMC Comment – Now that we have 2 CWO appointed by the CCB, it is their task to be proactive and be responsible so these amendments reflect those changes
- (9) **Child Protection**
Rule 7.2.4 **Delete** *(no longer required as Self Dec Forms have been withdrawn)*
Rule 7.2.4.1 **Delete** *(as above)*
- (10) **Amend Rule 6.5.2 to read:** ...appropriate sanctions (Rules 29, 37)
Create new Rule 6.5.3 – the procedure for a Club to appeal against a decision of the LMC Disciplinary Committee is described in Rule 30
LMC Comment – Another tidy up
- (11) **Create new Rule 9.3.1.12 to read:** Failure by a club in the Higher Tier to submit a completed Umpire Assessment Report form to the CACO Appointments Officer as required by Rule 21.4.1.1 - £10 per report form
LMC Comment – We have had a lot of late reports this last season and we need to consider stronger sanctions as these reports may be wanted twice a season by ECB next year
- (12) **Create new Rule 11.1.12 to read:** Where a Club seeking promotion can evidence that the required standard of facilities will be in place and meet the League requirements (see also Rule 34 for the Higher Tier) before the following AGM, then that Club shall be considered for promotion.
LMC Comment – This gives the LMC the opportunity to permit a club to be considered for promotion where winter work will enable them to reach a required standard as set by the LMC
- (13) **Add to Rule 12.2.7**as appropriate.
LMC Comment – Minor amendment
- (14) **Create new rule 13.1.5 to read**
A traditional 'cricket tea' must be provided by the home club at the venue. This to be taken during the interval between innings, or earlier at the direction of official umpires, or with the agreement of both captains in the Intermediate and Standard tiers.
LMC Comment – To officially state the standard and accepted requirement.

- (15) **Add to Rule 13.2.1** - for clubs in the Higher Tier and Division 2.
Amend Rule 13.2.2 – *From season 2010*, all Higher Tier Clubs and Division 2 Clubs shall have grounds graded each year by the Grounds Committee *in accordance with Rules 13.2.2.1, 13.2.2.2, 13.2.3, 13.2.3.1, 13.2.4, 13.2.4.1*
Amend Rule 13.2.5 - and each club shall receive their ground grading at the end of the season.
LMC Comment – Paves the way for the Higher Tier grounds assessment system to be introduced to Division 2 next year
- (16) **Amend Rule 15.1.6 to read:**
All Clubs are to encourage membership of their Play Cricket website by displaying a poster in Club buildings. All clubs are to review their existing league registrations annually and remove any players from the Cornwall Cricket League registrations on their Club Play Cricket website where a player has not played for their club in the previous season. Any such player will then become available to register at any Club when they wish to play cricket again. The club must then confirm to the league registrations secretary the accuracy of their Club's registrations list. Any deletions, amendments to players addresses or other details should be made at their Club's Play cricket website by the Club's Play Cricket Administrator. The annual notification should be received by the League registrations secretary before the commencement of the season's fixtures. Any Club failing to make this annual confirmation return will be fined by the League. The annual confirmation return form may be found on the Cornwall Cricket League website.
- (17) **Delete Rule 16.4 (repeat) and Renumber present 16.5 to 16.4**
- (18) **Amend Rule 18.6.4.1 to read** – Any such penalty shall be applied *by the umpires at the conclusion of the match and shown on the match report sheet. An appeal against any such penalty must be sent to the Results Secretary with an appeal fee of £20; the Results Secretary's decision, after consultation with the umpires, shall be final and binding.*
LMC Comment – Sorts out the responsibility of the umpires on match day leaving the Results Sec only to act as an appeal route if necessary
- (19) **Rule 14.4.1 Delete second & third sentences** "Clubs mustengagement."
Replace with "*Clubs must apply to the Border Agency for a sponsor's licence before they can employ an overseas player/coach under the points based managed migration system*".
- (20) *As supported by the Chairman of the Cornwall Cricket Board, to change the Appeal system for discipline complaints relating to alleged breaches of the Code of Conduct and the Spirit of Cricket back to the LMC:*
Leave Rules 26 – 29 unchanged

Amend/new Rule 30 as follows:

Rule 30 Appeals Procedures

30.1 Administration Appeal - refers to all CCL administration rules

Insert section 6.7 and related sub sections and renumber as 30.1

30.2 Discipline Appeal – refers to all breaches of the Code of Conduct and the Spirit of Cricket

30.2.1 A player of a club shall have the right of appeal to the Cornwall Cricket League Appeals Committee. Notice of Appeal, setting out the grounds, must be received in writing by the League Assistant Secretary within seven days of the decision of the Disciplinary Committee. A deposit of £50 must accompany the Notice of Appeal; this deposit will be forfeited if the Appeal is not successful in all aspects. The player and/or club shall have the same rights of attendance and representation and the right to call witnesses as before the Disciplinary Committee.

30.2.2 If a Notice of Appeal is received within the seven days, any previous penalty(s) shall be suspended pending the outcome of the Appeal.

30.2.3 The Notice of Appeal, grounds and deposit will be immediately passed by the League Assistant Secretary to the Appeals Committee Chairman who shall set an appeal date which shall take place as early as possible. Decisions of the Appeal Committee shall be by majority vote; when necessary, the Chairman shall have a casting vote.

30.2.4 The composition of the Appeals Committee is described in 6.5.3

30.2.5 The Appeals Committee may confirm, vary or reverse the decision(s) of the Disciplinary Committee and also shall have the power to increase the penalty(s) and award costs of the Appeal.

Amend as follows

6.5 Disciplinary and LMC Appeals Committees

6.5.1 as before

6.5.2 as before

6.5.3 – **LMC Appeals Committee** – the LMC shall annually appoint in February, an Appeals Committee to hear appeals relating to breaches of the Code of Conduct and the Spirit of Cricket. The Appeals Committee shall consist of an Appeals Committee Chairman and at least 4 other members (minimum of 3 to sit); the Appeals Committee Chairman shall be a member of the LMC but the other members may be co-opted at the discretion of the LMC.

LMC Comment – Disciplinary Appeals to revert to being under the auspices of the League. LMC Administration Appeals remain under the auspices of the Board as per Rule 6.7

- (21) **Rule 21.1.5 Create New rule**
For season 2010, the expenses of official umpires shall be (for each umpire) £30 per match in Premier League & County Division 1, £25 per match in Division 2 and £12 per match for all 20/20 league competitions.

LEAGUE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE / CORNWALL ASSOCIATION CRICKET OFFICIALS
LMC Comment – ECB guidelines
- (22) **Rule 21 Umpires & Scorers Amend as follows:**

21.1 Expenses
21.1.1 The expenses of Official Umpires shall be shared equally by both clubs and must be paid *before the match commences*
21.1.2 The expenses of the official umpires shall be decided annually at the League AGM and listed in the next LMC Newsletter to all clubs; these expenses shall refer to all league matches and to all other competitions played under the auspices of the LMC where official umpires are appointed by the CACO
21.1.3 Where the expenses paid by the clubs to the umpires do not meet their expenses, the CACO shall apply to the CCB Hon. Sec. for specific further funding.
21.1.4 - as before
21.1.5 – *see proposal 20*

21.2 - unchanged
21.3 - unchanged
21.4 - unchanged except for:
21.4.1.2 - failure to do so shall result in a £5 fine for each late report and an additional fine of £1 for every day late thereafter in returning the report. Persistent failure to submit these reports in time will be referred to the LMC Disciplinary Committee and may result in the club concerned being subject to the penalties in Rule 29.
- (23) **Create new rule 21.5 to read**
For all Higher Tier and Division 2 East and Division 2 West matches where panel umpires are appointed, those umpires shall submit a grounds assessment card direct to the Grounds Committee Chairman within 4 days of the conclusion of the match. For matches in Divisions 2E and 2W where no appointed panel umpire is standing, the grounds assessment card must be completed in confidence by the away captain and submitted separately and direct to the Grounds Committee Chairman within 4 days of the conclusion of the match.
LMC Comment – To cover the extension of the existing grounds assessment system to Divs 2 East & West in 2010
- (24) **Rule 26** Move second paragraph to become **Rule 31 (iv)** and renumber existing **Rules 31 (iv) and 31 (v)**
- (25) **Delete Rules 33.1 33.2 and 33.3** as repeats (leaving 33.4 33.5 and 33.6 in place but renumbered within Rule 33). **Move rule 33.2** (team sheets) to a new 36.7 as this requirement also applies to all clubs in all Divisions and reword....
In compliance with the Laws of Cricket (2003), all clubs must provide the umpires/captains with a fully completed Team Sheet that must identify all team members (including 12th man) before the start of the match. The team sheet must also indicate the ages of any players under 19 years of age and therefore subject to the ECB Directives described in the subsections of Rule 36. The team sheet must be sent to the League with the match result sheet (see also 9.3.1.5).
- (26) **To establish a Women’s Tier for the management and administration of women’s league cricket in Cornwall**
- **Amend 3.4.1 to read:** Only affiliated member clubs, the Cornwall Association of Cricket Officials, **the Cornwall Women’s Cricket Association (CWCA)** and the LMC may submit proposals for changes to the Rules and Constitution.
 - **Create new rule 3.7.4 to read:** *the Women’s Tier shall send one representative per women’s league club to the League AGM.*
 - **Amend 3.8.1.9.1 to read:** *Two representatives for each of the Higher, Intermediate and Standard Tiers (rule 10)*
 - **Create new rule 3.9.1.4 to read:** *Women’s Tier – one vote per women’s league club*
 - **Create new rule 6.8 to read:** *Women’s League Cricket LMC Representative - the CWCA shall elect at their AGM a representative to serve on the LMC.*

- **Amend 10 to read:** *Composition of the League*

10.1 The CCL shall adopt a 4 tier structure to comprise:

10.1.5 Women's Tier (League Cricket) – shall be managed and administered by the CWCA on behalf of the CCL in accordance with League Rules specific to Child Protection(7), Health & Safety(8), Player Qualifications(14), Code of Conduct (Section D), Discipline (Section E), Advertising Insignia (35) and ECB Directives (36). League match playing conditions for the Women's Tier are determined as per Rule 20(b). The Women's Tier is restricted to women players only.

- **Amend 15.1.1.1 to read:** no player shall be registered concurrently with more than one club in the League with the exception of women players who may register with one club to play league cricket within the Higher, Intermediate or Standard Tiers and register with one other club to play specifically within the Women's Tier.
- **Amend 17.3.2 to read:** Clubs may have no more than 4 teams participating within the Higher, Intermediate, Standard Tiers in any season. A club may have a 5th team provided that team plays in the Women's Tier.
- **Create new rule 20(b) to read:** *Match Playing Conditions – Women's Tier*

The CWCA shall each year at their AGM make such rules as required for the match playing conditions of women's league cricket in Cornwall; these rules shall be submitted in February of each year to the LMC for ratification. A copy of these rules shall be placed in the Yearbook of the Cornwall Cricket Board.

LMC Comment – To support the development of women's league cricket in Cornwall.

Tier Rules: In order to ensure all Higher and Intermediate tier rules can, if required, be amended independently the tier rules 19 & 20 sub sections may be reorganised and renumbered by the LMC prior the 2010 Yearbook and Cornwall Cricket Website publication. No alterations to the actual rules wordings will be made of course.

*In the event of paper ballot for any of proposals 1-26 **Ballot Paper 'A'** to be completed by all clubs and collected at this stage.*

HIGHER TIER – PREMIER & COUNTY 1 2010 ONLY to vote- 1 vote per team

- (27) **Amend rules 18.13 & 19.5 Wide Ball to read:**

In addition to MCC Law 25, the following shall apply in the Higher Tier.

18.13.1 & 19.5.1 Any offside or legside delivery which in the opinion of the umpire does not give a batsman a reasonable opportunity to score shall be called and signalled a wide. For guidance purposes in adult cricket, a legside wide should be called and signalled if a delivery passes on the legside outside the pads of the batsman standing in a normal guard position.

Delete Rule 38 as inaccurate.

No reference to any picture and this is introduced to have consistency. To include the batsman stepping away outside leg stump and the bowler adjusting but only being called wide for bowling outside his leg side.

ST JUST CRICKET CLUB

- (28) **Create New 20/20 Competition and Edwards Cup Final Rules for Premier and County One (Higher Tier) 2010**

Proposed rules based on ECB generic rules. Existing Hawkey and Vinter Cup rules (23.2 & 23.3) remain unaltered.

23.5 County 20/20 and Edwards Cup Final Rules and Conditions

- 23.5.1 The 20/20 County and Edwards Cup Final will be run under the auspices of CCL. The LMC shall have the powers to deal with all matters not covered by the competition rules and the LMC's decision shall be final. The County 20/20 competition is restricted to teams in the Premier and County 1 and will be played initially in 4 zones; the teams within each zone will be decided by the LMC. Entry is mandatory for all Higher Tier teams. Each club plays 4 or 5 matches and the winner from each zone will go forward to the semi finals and finals to be played on a Sunday at a selected venue. The zone matches will be played from late June to early August with the Finals Day in August, the match dates will be decided by the LMC. The entry fee for the competition is £5 per team.
- 23.5.1.1 The admission fees to the Finals Day shall be £3 per person and £1.50 for OAPs and children under 16
- 23.5.1.2 Any club having 2 sides in the County 20/20 is placed on its honour not to select regular 1st team players in its second side especially should their first side not qualify for the Finals Day.
- 23.5.2 All trophies must be returned to the Competition Secretary/Trophy Curator on or before 1st May each year
- 23.5.3 Every player shall be qualified and registered as per League Rules 14 & 15. Any player, having played in any stage/match of a 20/20 cup competition is thereby cup tied and not therefore eligible to play for any other club in a League 20/20 competition for the season. Guest players are not permitted.
- 23.5.4 The winners of the Hawkey and Vinter competitions shall compete in the Edwards Cup Final.
- 23.5.5 Any byes must be advised 7 days prior to the match to the Competition Secretary; otherwise a fine of £20 per match will apply
- 23.5.6 Zone matches cancelled due to the weather to be mutually rearranged.

Match format for all stages of the County 20/20 and Edwards Cup Final

- 23.5.7 **Umpires** – umpires will be appointed by CACO for all games in the County and Edwards competitions. The umpire expenses fee will be £12 per game; each club will pay one umpire.
- 23.5.8 **Hours of Play** – No match may start later than 6.00pm. Teams have 1 hour 15 minutes to bowl 20 overs; in the event of an interruption or delay during the 1st innings, the umpires shall reduce the number of overs in the match total by one over for every full 3.75 minutes lost in that innings. In the 2nd innings of the match, overs shall be reduced by one over in that innings for every full 3.75 minutes lost unless the 1st innings has finished early in which case no time will be lost in the 2nd innings until the time that has been gained has been subsequently lost.
A 6 run penalty (to be added to the batting side total) shall apply for each over not bowled in the required innings time as determined by the umpires. In reduced over matches, the fielding side has a one over leeway and the umpires may also allow for stoppages
- 23.5.9 **The Result** – Each side must have faced or had the opportunity to face 6 full overs per innings to constitute a match. In the event that the side batting second cannot complete its allotted overs due to weather or light conditions, the target score shall be calculated by average run rate based on the number of legitimate balls bowled. If tied on average run rate, the number of extras will decide the result; if still tied, the match will be declared a draw.
- 23.5.10 **Balls** – current League match balls will be provide by the home side for each game with acceptable spares. The LMC will provide the balls for the semi finals and final of the County 20/20 and the Edwards Cup Final.
- 23.5.11 **Fielding restrictions**
- No side may have more than 5 fielders on the leg side at the moment of delivery throughout the innings; any infringement of fielding restrictions will be called No Ball by the striker's end umpire.
 - As in the Higher Tier league matches (Rule 18.8.1 to 18.8.1.4), a 30 yard circle will be drawn on the field of play; for the first 6 overs of each innings, a maximum of two is permitted outside the 30 yard circle at the moment of delivery. After 6 overs have been bowled, 4 fielders (not including bowler and wicket keeper) must be within the 30 yard circle at the moment of delivery.

Where overs have been reduced, the table below will be applied by the umpires to determine the fielding restrictions for the 30 yard circle:

Total overs	5-6	7-9	10-13	14-16	17-19
Number of overs with restrictions	1	2	3	4	5

- 23.5.12 **Overs per bowler** - each bowler may bowl a maximum of 4 overs or not more that 20% of the overs available in a reduced overs game unless such a number has been exceeded before the interruption.
- 23.5.13 **MCC Laws of Cricket** (2003 Edition) shall be followed with the following exceptions
- 23.5.13.1 Free hit after a no ball foot fault – the delivery following the call of No Ball for a foot fault shall be a free hit for whichever batsman is facing. If the free hit delivery is itself not a legitimate delivery, then the next delivery shall become a free hit for whichever batsman is facing.
- 23.5.13.2 Wide ball – any legside delivery i.e. that passes outside of the leg stump, shall be deemed a wide. Any offside delivery which in the judgement of the umpire does not give the batsman a reasonable chance to strike the ball shall be deemed a wide ball also. A mark shall be placed on either side of the wickets at each end set at 3' from the middle stump to assist as guidance for the umpires for offside deliveries.
- 23.5.13.3 Fast short pitched bowling - a bowler shall be limited to ONE such delivery per over. Such a delivery is defined as a ball which passes or would have passed over the **shoulder** of the striker standing upright at the crease – the umpire will call and signal No Ball for such a delivery and remind the bowler that only one fast short pitched delivery is permitted per over. A repeat within an over shall initiate the warning sequence as described in MCC Law 42.6.
- 23.5.13.4 High pitched balls (beamers) – either umpire may call and signal such a delivery defined as one that passes or would have passed above the waist of the striker standing upright at the crease **irrespective of the speed of the delivery**. Any such delivery must initiate the warning sequence of MCC Law 42.8.
- 23.5.14 **Scoring of Points** - For the County 20/20 competition, the points scoring system described in 23.3.24 and 23.3.25 above applies.

- 18.15.2 Each match will consist of 100 overs maximum.
- 18.15.3 The competition shall be played in two stages.
Part 1. Teams will be grouped into two geographical area leagues of 5 teams in each League to play each other once. The LMC will decide the composition of each area league. Winners of their respective Leagues will go forward to:
Part 2 A knock-out Finals Day to be held on a Sunday at a neutral ground; the League to supply umpires, balls & teas.

- 18.18.2 If the start of the match is delayed or the match is interrupted during the first innings for any reason, the umpires shall determine the number of overs to be deducted.
- 18.18.2.1 The overs available to each side shall be reduced by one over for every seven minutes of any delay or interruption to the first innings, provided that the overs available to each side does not fall below 20.
- 18.19 Scoring of Points (within area leagues)**
- 18.19.1 Match Points shall be awarded as follows:-
10 points for outright win 5 points for tie or draw with the scores level
6 points for cancellation or abandonment as decided by the appointed umpires.
